

Dear Friends! December 2019







'The ones that got away'.

We have all heard the phrase, 'the fish that got away'. Obviously that phrase can be applied to a number of things such as fishing, hunting and even to the collector car hobby. As you have probably already surmised where I am going with this, I too have a couple of stories about 'the one's that got away'.

Traveling back in time to the early '70's when I was attending college and was newly married, I became aware of a '65 Cobra. It was equipped with a small block, 289 cubic inch Ford motor with four Weber downdraft carburetors, and a four-speed transmission. Asking price: \$6,800.00. At the time, I owned a 1966 Austin Healey 3000 and for all intents and purposes, it was a good car. But the thought of owning a Cobra, would have put me into a totally different league! Not having a full-time job and my wife being a newly hired teacher, we were not overly flushed with money. I tried to talk the owner of the Cobra into taking the 'Big Healey' as part of the sale, but his answer was 'cash works best for me'. Enrolled in college, no full-time job, fresh out of the service and no savings, I had to pass on the Cobra. Fast forward to today. If I were to own the Cobra today, my 401K plan would have looked great as most Cobra's are now selling well into the seven-figure range and yes, it got away from me!

Traveling back to the early '70's again the next car that got away from me was

a 1952 300S Mercedes convertible coupe. From 1952 to 1957, Mercedes total production for this model was a mere 760 cars for the entire global market. The owner of this car was in my wedding. He purchased the car in 1962 when he was working in Germany and had it shipped back to the U.S. Deciding he did not want the car any longer, he put it up for sale for \$5,000.00. My wife and I went to see it with the thoughts that we might be able to make a deal. Our efforts proved to be fruitless, and we had to pass on the car for the very same reasons that we had to pass on the Cobra.

Today, the 300S Mercedes are valued in the three hundred-thousand-dollar range and they are highly collectable. The brighter side of this car is that, my friend still owns the car! Unfortunately, the car is no longer for sale and it just sits in storage on a slow journey back to nature. Along with that fact, yours truly is fast approaching the age that a full and complete restoration project is fading faster then a double 'A' top fuel dragster that runs the 1,000 foot drag strip. And as the story goes, 'I thought I might catch it, but it got away'.
