## START

 Turn LEFT onto Corunna Rd. (West) Drive 0.3 Miles

Look out for the FIRST QUESTION

  Turn LEFT onto S Dye Rd. (South) Drive 2 Miles


*Just before your right on Miller Rd, see our Sponsor "Ford's Party Rental / Valley Tent"*

  Turn RIGHT on Miller Rd. (West) Drive 7.3 Miles

Look out for the SECOND QUESTION

*You are passing through Swartz Creek.*

Look out for the THIRD QUESTION just before your turn

 Stay to the LEFT to stay on LANSING RD. (West) Drive 0.7 Miles



 Sharp RIGHT onto W County Rd/Sheridan Ave. (North) Drive 5.5 Miles

Follow Sign to SAGINAW

You will be passing through Lennon.

*There's a Lennon Cafe on your right that is GREAT! The village was founded by Peter Lennon. He got the Grand Trunk Western Railroad routed through the settlement and a depot built there. He built a grain elevator, which is followed by other businesses. A post office was established in Genesee County in July 1880 with Lennon as the first postmaster. The office was transferred to Shiawassee County in February 1889. The village was incorporated in the 1970's.*

 Turn RIGHT on Beecher Rd. (East) Drive 0.9 Miles

*You will see a solar farm on your left*

 Turn RIGHT on Duffield Rd. (South) Drive 0.2 Miles




## Tour STOP - Enjoy Almar Orchards

16.9 Miles

FYI: The next part of the Rally will take you over 1.5 hours to drive. So enjoy.



 Turn LEFT out of Almar Orchards

 Turn RIGHT on Beecher Rd. (East) Drive 2.5 Miles

Look out for the **FOURTH QUESTION**

  Turn LEFT onto N. Seymour Rd. (North) Drive 6.4 Miles

*You will pass Seymour Elementary School and Sports Complex*

*When you come into Flushing, you will see W. Main Street. This road would take you into downtown Flushing. Flushing originated as a mill town in the mid-1830s. Its location along the Flint River, the county's largest river, was a decisive factor in its settlement. Water power potential was a significant determinant for the selection of the settlement areas throughout the nineteenth century.*

*In addition to its water power, the area around Flushing was also well suited to agricultural pursuits.*


Look out for the **FIFTH QUESTION**

  Turn RIGHT on Mount Morris Rd. (East) Drive 17.9 Miles

You will travel through Mt. Morris MI.

*Benjamin Pearson was the first settler in the area in 1833. In 1836, Frederick Walker was the first to settle within the future village site. A post office named Mount Morris was established on July 11, 1837, with Charles N. Beecher as the first postmaster. The name of the office was changed to Genesee on January 19, 1839, and back to Mount Morris on April 25, 1857.*

Look out for the **SIXTH QUESTION**

  Turn RIGHT onto M-15 / State Rd. (South) Drive 8.1 Miles

You will be traveling through Davison MI.

*Explore over 11,000 acres of woods, water and trails in Michigan's largest county park system. Richfield County Park has year round activities for the outdoor enthusiast. Play a round or two of golf at several courses, and take some time to shop at The Agitated Grape, Davison Market or*

*Card Table Republic. Fan Favorite is Whitey's known for Fresh seafood, award-winning fish & chips, and friendly service.*

  Turn RIGHT onto Lippincott Blvd (West) Drive 2 Miles

  Turn RIGHT onto Irish Rd. (North) Drive 0.4 Miles

Look out for the SEVENTH QUESTION

Look out for the EIGHTH QUESTION

  Turn LEFT onto Lapeer Rd. (West) Drive 6.5 Miles

  Turn LEFT onto E. Court St. (West) Drive 5.1 Miles

You will be traveling through Flint MI, and cross over Saginaw Street.

*Flint is the largest city and seat of Genesee County, Located along the Flint River, 66 miles (106 km) northwest of Detroit, it is a principal city within the region known as Mid Michigan. Flint was founded as a village by fur trader Jacob Smith in 1819 and became a major lumbering area on the historic Saginaw Trail during the 19th century. From the late 19th century to the mid 20th century, the city was a leading manufacturer of carriages. This history is rich in Flint. This is also the home of Back to the Bricks, Main Event which will be held August 17, 2024.*

Look out for the NINTH QUESTION

  Turn LEFT onto Corunna Rd. (S/West) Drive 3.5 Miles
